WHY APPLY NOW?

- 1. Help is here. Free preparation assistance for the application, ESL, and the citizenship exam is available, regardless of income.
- 2. Fee waivers are available.
- 3. To vote in the next election
- 4. To qualify for more forms of public assistance
- 5. So you will not fear being deported/removed
- 6. Because you are likely eligible.
- 7. To help other family members immigrate from abroad.

MYTHS & FACTS

You need to be fluent in English to pass.

If you fail the exam, you have to reapply.

If you receive public assistance (such as Medicaid), you will automatically be denied.

If you become an American, you must give up your other citizenship. You need to be proficient, not fluent, in English.

If you fail the exam, you can try again, for free, within 90 days.

You cannot be denied citizenship for receiving public assistance. In fact, you may qualify for a fee waiver if you receive public assistance.

In many countries, including the United States, dual citizenship is recognized. Consult an immigration attorney for country-specific questions.
